You Can Do It


You Can Do It is our Social and Emotional Health program. The program was developed by Professor Michael Bernard from the University of Melbourne and is an evidence-based program.

Five main Keys are developed through the program: Confidence, Persistence, Organisation, Resilience and Getting Along.


The third key is Organisation.

Permission forms will be in the office.










BUSY BEE
